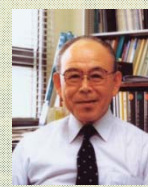

Research Excellence

- Globally renowned award-winning faculty including Nobel Laureates, winners of the Fields Medal, the King Faisal International Prize, and other awards
- Recipient of one of the largest numbers of the “Global Center of Excellence” (GCOE) research grants allocated by the Japanese government
- Highly ranked in ISI Essential Science Indicators
- Active in research collaborations, especially with Asian countries

Quality in Education
