“Program for Core Human Resources Development: For the Achievement of the Common Good (*Bonum Commune*) and Re-evaluation of Classical Culture in East Asia”

【Aim of project, Ideals of Global Human Resource on the project】

The program aims to develop future leaders in various areas such as regional public service, medicine, environmental studies, energy, technology, business, and so on, who embody the intellectual understanding of shared Asian values, histories and cultures with broad international/regional perspectives

【Summary of project】

In order for the creation of a shared Asian value system and the human resource development such as regional officials, medical professionals, and business leaders, the program aims to establish a joint education system in East Asia.

■ Forming the University Network with Quality Assurance

〈Common textbooks edited in cooperation with instructors from three countries〉



○ Improving the Common Good Education & Human Resource Development

Construction of the Common Good based co-curriculum generalized from the results of research activities between three Universities for more than two years. Completion of systematic cross-disciplinary matrix. Publication and promotion of the exploitation of the Common Good based textbooks.

○ Enhancing Partnership and Experimental Classroom

Education content enriched with multilingual seminars, Campus Asia seminars, summer school, short-term language study program, China-Korea workshops, etc. Unity of original instructors involved in the Common Good Education.

○ Established Nano-biology Course Opened to Exchange Students Majoring in Natural Sciences

Programs have been made more inclusive to students majoring in natural sciences. Workshops for students majoring in natural sciences and the Nano-biology course for medical, dentistry, and pharmaceutical students have been re-designed to enrich more exchange programs of natural sciences among partnering universities.

■ Contents of the Programs, Preparation for the Start of the Programs

○ Establishing an Education System for Global Liberal Arts in East Asia

Multilingual seminars with local language intensive courses, Summer school, China-Korea workshop, Machinaka (downtown) campus, cross-cultural understanding lectures, Nano-Biotechnology course, Natural Sciences workshops etc., PBL・CBL (Community Based Learning) made the basis for curriculum which was systematized as “Education System for Global Liberal Arts in East Asia”, and this education model has made a step forward.

○ Preparing for Establishment of International Collaborative Program for Graduate Studies

Agreements on Double degree in Social sciences, Education Sciences, Natural Sciences, Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmaceutical Sciences were concluded, developing negotiations for Joint degree, and accumulated collaborative programs created the basis for Establishment of International Collaborative Program for Graduate Studies.

○ Sustainable Development of the Program

To sustain the Program’s stability the direction of the Program expansion was defined (enrichment of Education System for Global Liberal Arts in East Asia, continuation of textbook edition, development of international young medical practitioners training program for Nano-Biotechnology course), and united with others international exchange programs at Okayama University.

■ Student-Mobility

○ Outbound (275 Japanese Students in Total)

Dispatched long-term: 40 students to Jilin University (China) and Sungkyunkwan University (Korea). SV: 235 students to partnering universities.

○ Inbound (131 Chinese and Korean Students in Total)

Accepted Long-term: 30 students from Jilin university and Sungkyunkwan university. SS: 101 students from partnering universities.

■ Promotion of Student-Mobility Environment

○ Sending Japanese Students to Partnering Universities

Development of education program before and after sending abroad to improve language skills, conducting China-Korea workshops to promote students for long-term exchange programs, preparing Credits transfer System for subjects taken during study abroad, introducing a monthly report system and distance learning guidance through iPad are provided to students.

○ Accepting Chinese and Korean Exchange Students from Partner Universities

Curriculum development, planning workshops in cooperation with the local communities and other universities, tutor arrangement, student clubs and intensive language study support, fully equipped guesthouse and community life participation are offered to students.

■ Internationalization of the university, Information disclosure and Publication of outcome

○ Transmission of Information and Dissemination of the Results through Various Reports

The program activities have been regularly publicized on the website (<http://campus-asia.csv.okayama-u.ac.jp/>). And this year, students are planning to publish the CAMPUS Asia newspaper “Haresia” 4 times a year. Moreover, program inspection which based on internal and external evaluations are constantly promoted. The program content is being continuously enriched.
