### Exchange Scheme using the Inter-University Consortium, INU

By using the framework of INU, an international consortium across Europe, U.S., Asia, Oceania, Africa and South America which Hiroshima University is a founding member and has a close relationship with common philosophy on "peace" and related problems, all the university is committed to carry out the cooperation in education.

### The University Exchange through Top Management

INU has successfully achieved the university exchanges for several years by various programmes implementation, under the leadership of top management of each university. Assembly twice a year(DVC etc) has established a successful PDCA cycle. Also, we hosted the INU President Summit, in commemorating the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, as well as celebrating the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the INU Student Seminar for Global Citizenship and Peace.

## Student-Mobility

### Outbound

Although the numbers of sending students had decreased from that of 2014, Hiroshima University had financially supported students through this project and also with our own fund and we had sent nearly 7 times as many students as planned in 2015.

### Inbound

Student Seminar on Peace is held in August every year, along with Master's Summer Schools on Peace, Environment and Nursing. Also we had received international students just as planned.
