GRIPS, the KDI School (KDIS) in Korea, and the School of Public Policy and Management (SPPM) at Tsinghua University in China jointly conduct global-standard public policy education for mid-career professionals in the public sector and key private sectors, centered on the social sciences.

O Strengthened Academic System

Improved the academic and thesis advising system by hiring a full-time professor who specializes in finance.

Organized short-term programs particularly aiming at students who are mid-career government professionals. Organized a one-month summer program, short-term visits (around 3 days), and special lectures, enabling students with time constraints to participate in each program at partner schools.

O Strengthened Academic System

To ensure smooth operation of the CAMPUS Asia Program, we hired a full-time staff in April, who is experienced in organizational management and negotiation. To ensure the provision of high-quality academic support, we hired a research associate in July, who is a Ph.D. holder and is fluent in Japanese, English, and Korean.

O CAMPUS Asia Fortnight(Summer Program) Held at GRIPS (Aug 12-22, 2013)

Five participants from SPPM and nine participants from KDIS took part in the CAMPUS Asia Fortnight at GRIPS where they took a regular, credit-bearing course on FDI, participated in field trips to the Bank of Japan and Nippon Koei Co., Ltd., and attended special lectures, and a reception.

O CAMPUS Asia Seminar Held at SPPM (Oct 29-Nov 1, 2013)

Eight Japanese students participated in regular SPPM courses and a cultural exchange event aimed at deepening friendship and cultural understanding between Japanese and Chinese students.

O CAMPUS Asia Field Trip Held at GRIPS (Jan 31-Feb 1, 2014)

Five students each from CAMPUS Asia and GRIPS's Japanese Language Program went on a field trip to Yamanashi and Shizuoka prefectures. They learned about the local government's initiatives to promote tourism and visited a strawberry farm and Yakult Factory.

O CAMPUS Asia GRIPS-KDIS Joint Seminar at KDIS(Mar 16-19, 2014) Five Ph.D. students from GRIPS and KDIS made presentations about their studies and dissertation. The students also audited a special lecture, took regular KDIS classes, and participated in an international students-

exchange reception.

O Amendments to the MOU between GRIPS, KDIS, and Tsinghua

The MOU has been amended to promote student exchange. Participants are no longer required to complete one semester of study at the parent institution before applying to the host institution. The period of stay at a single host institution has been extended from six to twelve months.

O Revised System for Recording Courses

We improved and clarified internal Credit Transfer Procedure. The new system allows recording on the transcript courses for which credit transfer has not been approved.

O CAMPUS Asia Promotion Using the Internet and Other Media

To promote the CAMPUS Asia Program and attract more students, the Program's website on GRIPS' homepage has been revamped and the voices and photos of participants have been updated. Promotion articles about CAMPUS Asia has been published in the "International Development Journal" and on the "Shinken-Ad" website.

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■ Forming the University Network with Quality Assurance

Effective Utilization of Credit Transfer System

Clarified procedures for the credit transfer system expedited its approval process and enabled 2014/15 double-degree students to build their overall course plans at an early stage of the academic year. Japanese students who earned credits from Summer Programs, to which credit transfer is not applicable, had them recorded in the footnote of their GRIPS transcripts.

Hired a Research Assistant who speaks English as well as Chinese. His communication skill as a student helped a lot in building human network for inbound students. His speaking Chinese was also helpful in China trip where English is not often understood.

O Close Contact with Partner Universities

In dispatching a first-ever long-term exchange student to KDI School in February, we created a safe environment for her by keeping close contact with the school's coordinator throughout the process from admission to dispatch, even after the start of her studies. The student's feedback will serve as an indication for next possible candidates in considering long-term study.

O CAMPUS Asia Fortnight (Aug)

Students from KDI School, Tsinghua Univ. and GRIPS gathered at GRIPS and took a regular credit-earning course, conducted the Development Policy Program – CAMPUS Asia joint study trip & workshop, and joined a field trip & cultural experience event, etc. Some of the programs involved international students of GRIPS, thus helping students formulate a Universitywide human network.

O Summer Program (Aug) / Term exchange (Oct-Dec) to KDI School Dispatched 3 students to KDI School for a 1 month programs consisting of field trips, auditing of credit-earning courses, etc., and 1 student for one term.

O Japan-China-Korea Joint Seminar (Dec)

5 students and faculty members respectively from China and Korea joined us for a joint seminar at GRIPS. In addition to a doctoral research presentation session, the 3 parties reflected upon the activities we have conducted over the 5-year project. Students from the 3 countries joined a round-table discussion and talked about the importance of communicating with each other, and what lies ahead in the future.

Promotion of Student-Mobility Environment

O Providing Wide-range of activities, promoting dissemination of information

To increase exchange opportunities for consortium students, various short and long term activities were offered. Information was disseminated right at the start: at the time of entrance guidance to attract more students. For Japanese students, our President himself urged students to take courses offered in English, and students who have joined the Project in the past made face-to-face presentations of their experience, thus inspiring students to join the exchange program.

O Study abroad as part of our educational program

While GRIPS is already international with two thirds of our students coming from abroad, our Japanese students tend to be domestic-oriented. Through this Project, two students have studied at KDI School for a term as part of the University's education program, and this was groundbreaking for GRIPS and has contributed in GRIPS' internationalization.
