#### Main Program (In Japan)

The project has organized a Semester Program in Japan where 10 students from universities in Southeast Asia studied variously at Osaka, Hiroshima or Meio Universities from the end of September 2013.

Main Program (In Southeast Asia)

The project has organized Semester Programs in Southeast Asia. 10 students from Osaka and Hiroshima University studied at universities in Southeast Asia for 4 to 6 months (1 semester).

#### Sub Program (In Japan)

The project has organized a 13-day short program for students from universities in Southeast Asia at Meio University. During the program, students attended lectures on peace studies which included military base and security matters in Okinawa. Sub Program (In Southeast Asia)

The project has organized a 10-days short program at Syiah Kuala University in Indonesia and a 7-day program at Pannasastra University of Cambodia for students from universities in Japan.

Main Program (In Southeast Asia)

The project has organized Semester Programs in Southeast Asia. 10 students from Osaka, Hiroshima, Nagasaki and Meio University studied at universities in Southeast Asia for 4 to 8 months (1 semester).

Sub Program (In Japan)

The project has organized a 10-days short program for students from universities in Southeast Asia at Hiroshima University. During the program, students attended the lectures on peace building, history, and the story of atomic bomb survivors in Hiroshima. **Sub Program (In Southeast Asia)** 

The project has organized a 11-days short program at De La Salle University in the Philippines for students from universities in Japan.

#### Student-Mobility Outbound

Following pre-screening and interviews, the project sent 10 Japanese students to the Main Program (1 student among the 10 was a full-time foreign student at Osaka University), and 13 Japanese students to the Sub Program (2 students among the 13 were full-time foreign students from Osaka and Hiroshima University, and 1 other student participated from Malaya University, Malaysia, so there were14 students in total).

#### Inbound

Following pre-screening and interviews, the project accepted 12 students to the Main Program and 12 students to the Sub Program.

The project has organized an 11-day short program for students from universities in Southeast Asia at Nagasaki University, and a 9-days short program at Chiang Mai University in Thailand for 15 students from universities in Japan.

#### Student-Mobility O Outbound

Following pre-screening and interviews, the project sent 9 Japanese students to the Main Program (2 students of the 9 were fulltime foreign students at Osaka University), and 15 Japanese students to the Sub Program (5 students among the 15 were fulltime foreign students from Osaka and Hiroshima Universities).

### Main Program (In Japan / Southeast Asia)

The project has organized Semester Programs in Japan where 11 students from universities in Southeast Asia studied variously at Osaka, Hiroshima or Meio Universities, and Semester Programs in Southeast Asia, where 9 students from Osaka, Hiroshima, Nagasaki and Meio Universities studied in Southeast Asian Universities for 4 months to 8 months.

## Sub Program (In Japan / Southeast Asia)

The project has organized an 9-day short program for 11 students from universities in Southeast Asia at Osaka University, and a 8-day short program at Pannasastra University of Cambodia for 10 students from universities in Japan.

### Student-Mobility O Outbound

Following pre-screening and interviews, the project sent 9 students to the Main Program (3 students of the 9 were full-time foreign students), and 10 students to the Sub Program (4 students among the 10 were full-time foreign students.

## Promotion of Student-Mobility Environment

### Organizing a course, seminars, briefings; instruction in English and other languages

On the Japan Consortium side, the project has set a course, seminars and briefings with professors from De La Salle, Nanyang Technological, and Pannasastra Universities to enhance interest in Southeast Asian studies, and has organized an English Café, has assisted English writing, and has taught Tetun (East Timor).

### Increasing English lectures, strengthening English administration, building systems of providing accommodation, providing tutors

The project has enhanced the administrative offices at universities in Japan. It has increased English lectures, has strengthened English administration, has established a system of support for short-term apartment contracts for exchange students and has provided foreign students with tutors.

## Internationalization of the university, Information disclosure and Publication of outcome

Double Degree Program, English-taught graduate school, increase of foreign students, website and multiple social media in English

Osaka University started a Double Degree Program with De La Salle University. Nagasaki University has developed a new graduate school fully taught in English. Osaka University's graduate school has seen a surge of foreign students in the past four years with 10 points of increase.
