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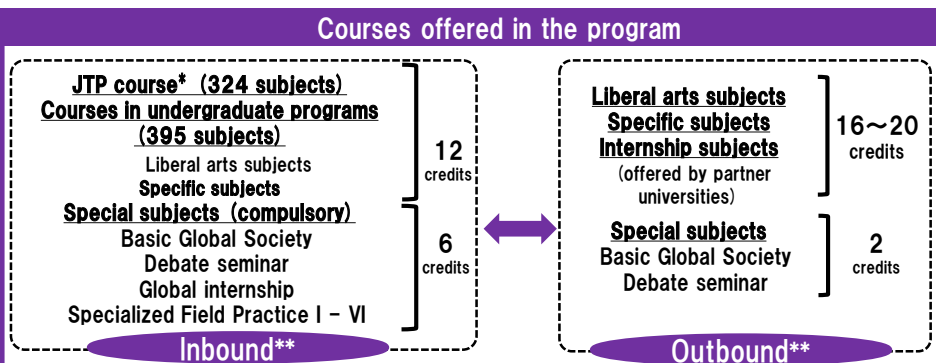

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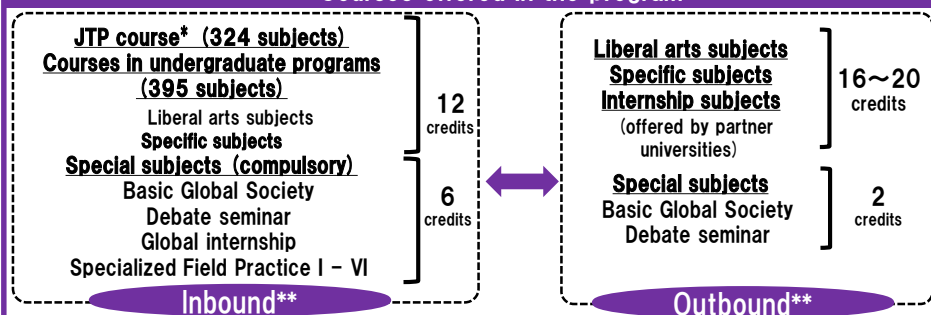

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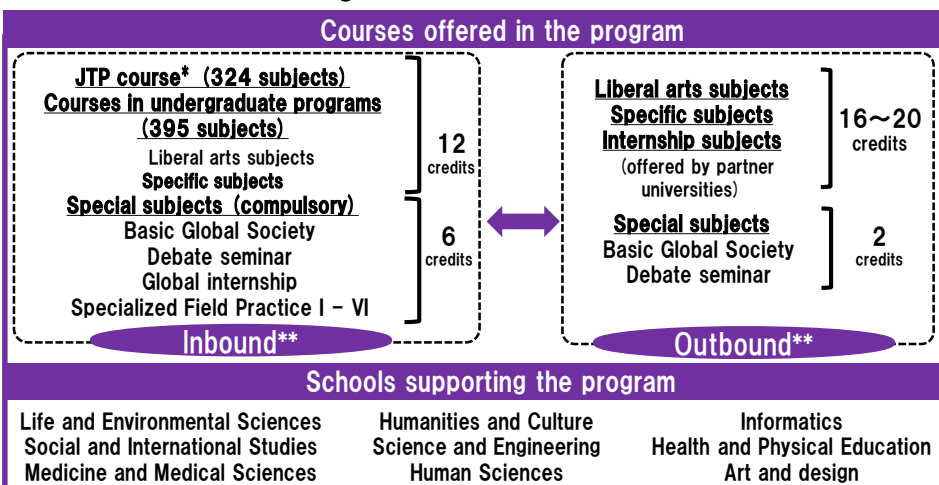

■ Program evaluation and extension

- Strengthen linkage with new partner universities through short-term pilot program and encouragement for student to apply for AIMS programme
- Starting a mobility program for graduate students with program partner universities
- Contribution to 2nd AIMS steering committee in Tokyo as a coordinator of AIMS programme in Japan
- Organizing a program committee with representatives from program partner universities as well as SEAMEO centers and start up a new program 'Campus to Campus Connectivity (CtCC)' which is aiming application of e-learning system and sharing research unit with partnership established through AISM program
