## [ Outline of survey ]

Social common capital provides members of the society with those services and institutional arrangements that are crucial in maintaining human and cultural life. It is generally classified into three categories: natural capital, social infrastructure, and institutional capital.

### [Expected results]

In the present study, we will be concerned with modifying and extending the theoretical premises of orthodox economic theory to make them broad enough to analyze the economic implications of social common capital, and to find the institutional arrangements and policy measures that will bring about the optimal state of affairs in which the natural and institutional components are blended together harmoniously to realize the sustainable state in the sense as introduced by John Stuart Mill in his classic *Principles of Political Economy* (1848), particularly in the chapter entitled " On Stationary States."
