As discussed with the school, my lecture provides students with the opportunity to learn about international relations and to understand the importance of learning English. I began my presentation by talking about my decision to go to law school, and I finished by presenting the research I am conducting at the University of Tokyo. This gives me the opportunity to talk about the role of various major European cities in international relations.

1. Law school in Belgium

I briefly explained why I had decided to study law. As I am from Belgium, I studied at the Université Catholique de Louvain (UCLouvain) in Belgium. Belgium is a small country that shares borders with France, the Netherlands, Germany and Luxembourg. I highlight the particularities of Belgium, including the coexistence of three official languages: French, Dutch and German. During my Master's degree, I spent a semester at the University of Geneva, which has a leading

program in international law. Geneva, Switzerland, is also a major city for international relations, as the headquarters of the United Nations and the International Labour Organization are located there.

2. Lawyer in Brussels

After graduating with my Master's degree, I spent almost a year working as a lawyer for a law firm specializing in labour law in Brussels. Brussels is the capital of both Belgium and the EU. Most EU institutions are located there, including the European Parliament and the European Commission. The headquarters of NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization) are also located here.

3. PhD program in Strasbourg

I decided to quit my job as a lawyer to join a PhD program at the University of Strasbourg. Strasbourg (France) is the second capital of the EU and home to the European Parliament (which is also located in Brussels). As part of my research, I had the opportunity to spend a few months at Ghent University in Belgium and Maastricht University in the Netherlands.

4. Postdoctoral fellowship in Tokyo

I was granted a JSPS fellowship, which led me to the University of Tokyo for two years to conduct research on social protection for non-standard workers. I applied a specific method to my research: empirical legal research.

In addition, I discussed the reasons why I decided to become a researcher, what I like about it and what I find interesting about my work.
