- Lecture summary (講演概要): Please summary your lecture 200-500 words.

In the introductory part the speaker will introduce the main theme – human migration – and outline the course of the lecture. The topics addressed (researcher's origin, career path and the research interest) will be presented through the lens of migration and mobility in order to offer an alternative perspective on human existence – a mobile rather than sedentary one.

The country of researcher's origin, Slovenia, will thus be presented as a result of century long migrations to and from very small but geopolitically rather important passage between geographically, culturally and politically diverse European regions and traditions. In this light the speaker's own migrations from a village-to-town-to-city-across-national-borders will be explained in order to give some critique on one of the main dichotomies of migration research - the divide between the internal migration and international one.

In the second part I will concentrate on the study of migration and ask why we should be interested in migrations? What do these processes tell us about our common human existence? Then I will address the ways of studying these phenomena - a wide range of academic disciplines and methodologies that ask different questions with the common aim to better understand these processes. The role of anthropology (the speaker's discipline) in the study of migration will be highlighted.

In the following, the speaker will reflect on her own research by contextualising it within the

contemporary migration flows from People's Republic of China. Here she will focus on the families in the migration process by giving examples from her recent fieldworks among Chinese migrants in Europe and Japan as well as her personal experiences. Special attention will be paid to the modes of cohabitation of migrant populations with the local ones. At the end the speaker will encourage participants to reflect on their own (or their family's) possible migration history and to discuss the most appropriate models of reception of newcomers.
