In my lecture I introduced students to moral philosophy. I described the five branches of philosophy (metaphysics, epistemology, logic, aesthetics and ethics). I then explained some of the aspects of morality that makes it different from self-interest. Using a series of examples and audience participation, I invited the students to think about two questions: (1) what makes morally wrong actions wrong? (2) why should we care about morality?
