Per the school's request, I talked about three main topics in my presentation.

First, I introduced myself and provided my background. I mentioned that I was born in Hong Kong and moved to the United States as a child. I discussed my parents' concerns about the 1997 handover of Hong Kong back to Chinese rule, then connected those fears to the current political volatility and the Umbrella Revolution. I encouraged the students to be politically informed and active. I then briefly discussed growing up in Los Angeles and the special relationship between the US and Japan.

Second, I discussed my life as a scholar. I charted the process of getting a doctorate in the United States. I outlined the different ways I have conducted fieldwork, including the nature of my questions with current and former officials. I outlined what professional conferences are like, and the process of improving my research and developing my ideas. I discussed why I came to Japan, and my life in Japan. I stressed the value of post-secondary education, and the available opportunities for the students.

Third, I discussed my research. I offered an overview of the field of international politics, and discussed the value of security institutions in the world. I outlined the way in which nuclear weapons affects all the countries in the world, and specifically those of Northeast Asia. I relayed the reasons why states decided to sign onto the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty in the 1960s, and the reasons why the treaty remains relevant. I went through its three goals – non-proliferation, disarmament, and peaceful development of nuclear energy – and discussed the major issues and challenges associated with each. I concluded by offering suggestions for how states can address major concerns.
