This program aims to establish a Trans Europe–East Asia educational scheme that integrates three different levels of education in the fields of the Humanities and the Social Sciences.

(Summary of project)

The program is comprehensively constructed so that students at each level can both develop the ability to take leadership from a global perspective and cultivate their capacity to seek resolutions to the various international problems beyond the confines of differing traditional values.

■ Establishment within the University Structure

1. Undergraduate Degree Program (Certificate) – JLCC

In addition to the University of Ljubljana, the Moscow City Teachers' Training University joined the program in 2012. Following discussion, two more partner universities are expected to join the program in 2013.

2. Masters Degree Program (Dual Degree) - TEACH

Before the commencement of the program, we conducted consultations on the dual degree system and its actual procedure. Three universities reached an agreement on the program. In March 2013 we had the first group of program students.

3. Doctoral Degree Program (Certificate) - COMPAS-CJS

A total of five students from four partner universities in Europe were accepted. Students followed lectures from the Humanities and Social Sciences. Also, students from the University of Tsukuba were dispatched to Europe to further their own research in comparative studies of contemporary Japanese and European societies.

1. Support for students dispatched from the University of Tsukuba
